In a world searching for purpose, **Ecclesiastes 12:13-14** offers a timeless conclusion:

"Let us hear the conclusion of the whole matter: Fear God, and keep his commandments: for this is the whole duty of man. For God shall bring every work into judgment, with every secret thing, whether it be good, or whether it be evil." (KJV)

These words, penned by King Solomon, remind us of life's ultimate purpose: to honor God and live according to His will. Everything we do, seen and unseen, will one day be judged. Let's explore these profound truths under three key themes: Fearing God, Obedience to His Commands, and the Certainty of Judgment.





## **Fearing God**

### The Foundation of True Wisdom

Many people pursue wealth, fame, and pleasure, only to find them empty of fulfillment. Solomon, the wisest man, concludes that true contentment is found in reverence for God. The fear of the Lord is not about terror but deep respect and awe for His power and authority.

#### The Beginning of Wisdom

**Proverbs 9:10** states, "The fear of the LORD is the beginning of wisdom: and the knowledge of the holy is understanding."

Recognizing God's authority is the first step to true understanding. A person who fears God will make wise choices, avoiding sin and embracing righteousness.

#### **Departing from Evil**

Similarly, **Job 28:28** says, "Behold, the fear of the Lord, that is wisdom; and to depart from evil is understanding." Wisdom is not about intellect alone, but about aligning our lives with God's truth. When we truly fear God, we gain clarity about what is right and wrong.

#### Living in Reverence

Unfortunately, many people live without considering God, prioritizing worldly success and self-gratification. # Keeping God's Commandments The Evidence of True Faith
