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# The Story of Samson

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**Judges 16:20 (KJV) And she said, The Philistines *be* upon thee, Samson. And he awoke out of his sleep, and said, I will go out as at other times before, and shake myself. And he wist not that the LORD was departed from him.**

This scripture describes a heartbreaking moment. Samson, unaware of his own spiritual weakness, attempts to confront his enemies, thinking he still possesses God-given strength. But tragically, he did not realize the Lord had left him.

Samson's story, while specific to his life, reflects a profound spiritual truth. There is a significant danger in relying on past encounters with God while ignoring present obedience. His assumption that he could rely on his own strength represents a common misconception among believers today.







# The Dangers of Spiritual Complacency

## What is Spiritual Complacency?

Spiritual complacency occurs when we become so comfortable in our faith that we stop actively seeking a relationship with God. Samson assumed he would always have God's strength. This led to a false sense of security, and ultimately, his downfall.

- Ignoring our daily prayer time
- Our Bible study time becomes intermittent or not at all
- We feel distant from God yet doing nothing to seek Him

## **A Wake-Up Call for Believers and Truth Seekers**

The story of Samson serves as a powerful reminder that we can't rely solely on past spiritual experiences or blessings to confirm that our relationship with Jesus is strong today. It's a wake-up call to stay connected and faithful in the present time. God's grace is always available, but we must actively seek it through prayer, scripture, and faith. For all truth seekers, this means taking that first step toward a sincere relationship with God, rather than assuming we can live our lives on our own terms and still have God's presence.



# Recognizing When God Departs

If reading scripture feels like a chore and conviction fades, it may indicate spiritual distance.

### 3 Growing Comfort with Sin

A lack of conviction or a casual attitude toward sin reflects a heart growing distant from God.

**2 Corinthians 13:5a Examine yourselves, whether ye be in the faith; prove your own selves.**

## A Call to Self-Examination

Staying close to God requires ongoing care, commitment, and attention, so that our spiritual roots remain strong and fruitful. For those seeking truth, it's important to regularly assess where you stand with God. Examine your life; are there areas where you've become distant from Him? Recognize that you need a Savior and that Jesus is the only way to salvation.

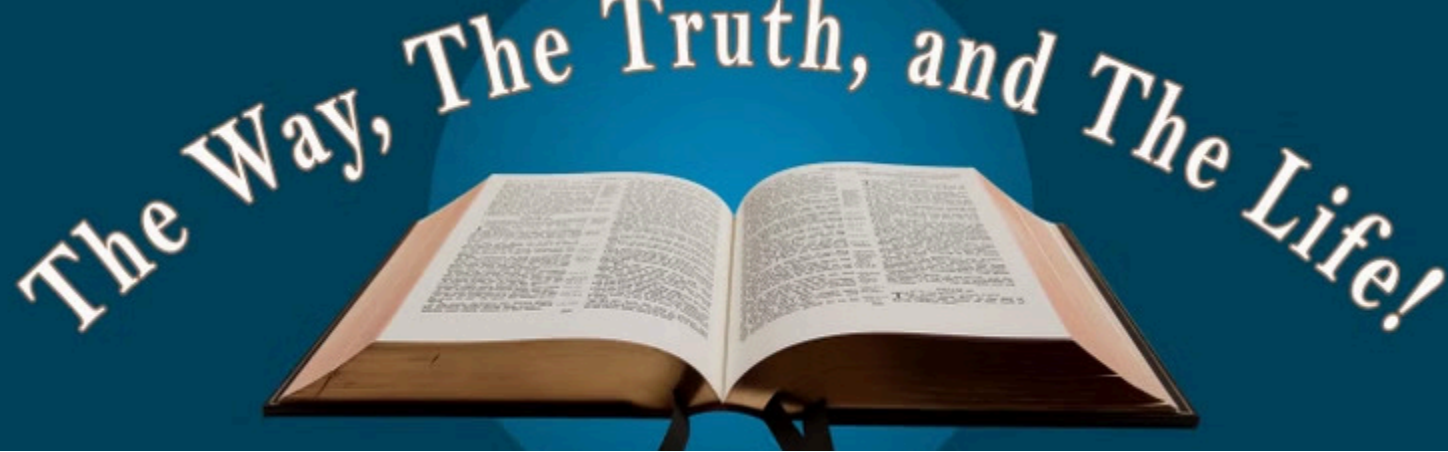
### Repent and Seek His Presence
